Made in London – Ella Bull

London-based designer/maker and jeweller Ella Bull realized she wasn't fit for a traditional path, so she moved to London and apprenticed to become a jeweller. She now makes bespoke pieces that "evoke a reverence of British heritage and eclecticism". This video is part of a series of Made in London videos, produced and directed by filmmaker William Scothern. 5 minutes.
